Environment

It's very pleasing to report that as part of our environmental programme 19 of the 20 trees planted in the village last autumn have survived. This is thanks to making the right choice of species (plaudits to Max Askew for his expert advice) and to all the 'sponsors' who kindly adopted a tree and for 'nursing' them through their first year. 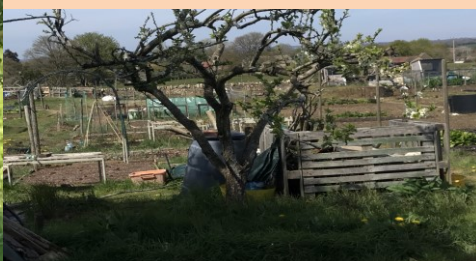


To continue this initiative next year, we are participating in the Queen's Green Canopy Programme by inviting you to, 'plant a tree for the Jubilee' You can join in by applying for a sapling simply by contacting the clerk on clerk@shiptonunderwychwood.org. The trees will be available for collection from the allotments in March of next year.

We have also placed a mixture of 9 Swift and House Martin bird boxes. Expertly constructed by Jeremy Huntingford we still have a few left so if you would like to contact me on timyates57@gmail.com, I can arrange one to be delivered to you.

Finally, we are very pleased to be supporting the Beavers, Cubs and Scouts in their Bug Hotel construction project. If you look carefully some of these are already visible in the allotments and The Wild Garden.

Allotments



The allotment field is looking good, and we have a few available for anyone interested in renting a plot. We have an excellent wildlife pond, new wildflower area coming by the spring, beehives and bug hotels and a place to sit and relax. Two new water troughs were installed this year and trees were planted as part of our 20 Trees for 2020, but unfortunately one died when the weather was very hot.

You may not know that the Parish Council awards small grants/donations to local organisations in October each year. Shipton Volunteers

In the last couple of years, the Shipton Volunteers have not managed to do as much round the village, as they could pre-Covid times. However, the second half of this year has been better and has seen us get back to our normal two mornings a month.

Section 106 Funding (monies provided by Deanfield Homes to support delivery of services & infrastructure following the building of the Oak Drive development)

Now that the Oak Drive development has been completed and the S106 funds released we would like to highlight how these funds have been distributed.

Firstly, under the terms of the deal, around £47,800 was earmarked for the playground which has been used to purchase a few new items for the younger children and to install a base around the wooden feet of the equipment to ensure more longevity for the current equipment. There is also some set aside for current and future maintenance.

The PC then distributed a sum of over £55,000 for capital items in the following way –

Wychwood Football Club £1950 for new storage facilities

Wychwood Wild Garden £4250 to purchase a new tractor

Sipton Cricket Club £21,900 to assist with the renovation of the clubhouse

New Beaconsfield Hall £27,554 for new lighting, staging, sound equipment, furniture and cloakroom refit.

Note that some of the amount credited to NBH were as a result of applications from other organisations like the Wychwood Players, Bumblefoot Rock Project and Wychwood BODS and Saplings.

Additionally, some money was set aside by WODC to purchase and install a piece of artwork. The Parish Council chose to commission local artist Christopher Townsend to produce a 'Wychwood Tree' which is now in place at the entrance to Oak Drive on the new development.

Slight rise in Precept

The PC has authorised a 3% rise in the precept for the next financial year. This is alongside using just under £10,000 of reserves to balance the budget. Planned expenditure next year includes continuing with the commitment to tree planting and maintenance, and consideration of the implementation of a reduction in the speed limit in parts of the village, as well as contributing to the running of the library and bus service. 3% equates to £1.62 per year for a Band D property so any rises in your Council Tax bill will be minimal.

Primary School

It has been a frustrating wait but the car park adjacent to the school is now open. The car park is part of the Oak Drive site and can be used by parents dropping off older children or parking for a short time to take small ones into their classrooms; a licence has been set up by Oxfordshire County Council and is held by the school and there are conditions to its use. It has been open for a few weeks and is working well so far.
